WORKSHOP MEETING MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hazelle Rogers called the February 27, 2017 Commission Workshop to order at 5:01 p.m. in the Alfonso Gereffi Room, located at 4300 N.W. 36th Street, Lauderdale Lakes, Florida 33319.

3. DISCUSSION

FEBRUARY 28, 2017 AGENDA REVIEW

This discussion serves to review the February 28, 2017 Commission Meeting Agenda.

City Manager Phil Alleyne stated that the TIGER Grant has been accepted by the state and the City's contribution has been reduced. City Manager Alleyne stated that the item will need to be placed on tomorrow night's agenda as a Goldenrod.

City Manager Phil Alleyne introduced the new Information Technology Manager Kurt Brown.

City Manager Phil Alleyne reviewed the February 28, 2017 Agenda with the Commission as follows:

ITEM 7A - ORDINANCE 2017-005 AMENDING SECTION 2-315 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS OF NON-STATUTORY BOARDS.

There was no discussion related to this item.

ITEM 9A - RESOLUTION 2017-021 APPROVING THE HOSTING OF THE 2017 UNIFEST EVENT, IN COORDINATION WITH THE GREATER CARIBBEAN AMERICAN CULTURAL COALITION, INC. ("GCACC")

There was no discussion related to this item.

ITEM 9B - RESOLUTION 2017-022 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK, TO EXECUTE AND ATTEST TO THE RECIPROCAL USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY AND THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES

Treasa Brown Stubbs, Director of Parks and Human Services spoke explained that the Reciprocal Use Agreement allows for public schools within Lauderdale Lakes to use City facilities and vice versa. Ms. Stubbs responded to questions regarding associated fees that are listed in the agreement. Ms. Stubbs stated that the City does not use the schools facilities as much as local schools utilize the City's facility.

ITEM 10A - RESOLUTION 2017-023 AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDING THROUGH THE STATE OF FLORIDA, DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT FOR THE HURRICANE LOSS MITIGATION PROGRAM ("HLMP") FOR THE 2017/2018 FUNDING YEAR, IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY FOUR THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$194,000.00) DOLLARS

Tanya Davis Hernandez, Director of Development Services spoke regarding the Hurricane LossMitigation Program (HLMP)Grant and stated that the grant helps residents hardened their homes. Ms. Hernandez stated that the City will administer the HLMP grant and will probably be able to assist 12 - 15 homes. Ms. Hernandez stated that City has the staff to be able to administer the program. City Manager Phil Alleyne chimed in that the reason the City is starting the process early is because the application has to be submitted by April 15, 2017.

ITEM 10B - RESOLUTION 2017-024 PROSPECTIVELY APPROVING THE ALLOCATION OF THE 43RD YEAR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM 2017/2018 FUNDING FROM BROWARD COUNTY AFTER A PUBLIC HEARING

Treasa Brown Stubbs, Director of Parks and Human Services and Tanya Davis-Hernandez, Director of Development Services provided information regarding the 43rd Year Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and responded to questions from the Commission regarding the different type of programs that can be administered through the program. Discussion ensued regarding the 40th year program, the approval letter to start the 43 year CDBG from Broward County, and when the city could expect to receive reimbursement funds.

ITEM 10C - RESOLUTION 2017-025 RATIFYING THE CITY MANAGER'S FILING OF THE CITY'S FISCAL YEAR 2017, PERIOD 3 (DECEMBER), FINANCIAL ACTIVITY REPORT AS PREPARED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCIAL SERVICES

Susan Gooding-Libiurd, Financial Services Director presented the Financial Activity Report for the month of December and responded to questions from the Commission.

ITEM 10D - RESOLUTION 2017-026 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE AND ATTEST, RESPECTIVELY, THAT CERTAIN GRANT AGREEMENT NO. LP06062, WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (FDEP) IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$200,000.00) DOLLARS, FOR THE WATER POLLUTANT REDUCTION TACTICS PROJECT, A SUMMARY OF WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT A

Moosgod Nasir Muhammand, City Engineer and Vince Richmond, Stormwater, Grounds and Streets Administrator provided a PowerPoint Presentation on the State of Florida Water Pollutant Reduction Tactics Project and responded to questions from the Commission regarding the different types of equipment, the cost associated with the equipment and the areas in which agitators will be placed. City Manager Phil Alleyne advised the Commission that a hardcopy of the presentation will be provided to them.

ITEM 10 E - RESOLUTION 2017-027 AUTHORIZINGTO REDUCE THAT CERTAIN LIEN ON REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY CAMILE COLA, GABRIEL COLA AND CHRISMENE COLA, AND LOCATED AT 3470 NW 32ND STREET

Tanya Davis-Hernandez, Director of Development Services and Edward Wallace, Code Compliance Supervisor provided information regarding a request to reduce the lien on property located at 3470 N.W. 36th Street, Lauderdale Lakes, Florida. Discussion ensued regarding the amount of administrative fees to be collected on lien requests. Consensus from the Commission is to make a motion to pull the item at tomorrow night's Commission Meeting.

5. ADDITIONAL WORKSHOP ITEMS

A. PRESENTATION REGARDING PEDESTRIAN SAFETY (5:30 P.M. TIME CERTAIN)

This is a presentation by city staff and invited partners regarding the Safe Street Campaign.

J. Gary Rogers, CRA Executive Director introduced members from the Healthy Community Zone Active Living Campaign who provided a PowerPoint Presentation on Alert Today, Alive Tomorrow related to pedestrian safety.

Peter Gies, Transportation Planner, Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization spoke regarding the Broward MPO Complete Streets Initiative and its mission to assist local governments in implementing Complete Streets in their respective communities by providing the necessary training and policy tools.

Discussion ensued regarding FY2017 FDOT project design funding for Pedestrian Safety improvements at Oakland Park and State Road 7, FY2017 FDOT project design funding for Pedestrian Safety improvements at the C-13 Greenway Trail at State Road 7, the Federal TIGER Grant for completion of the C-13 Canal Greenway Trail, and State of Florida Legislative Appropriation for NW 31ST Ave.

B. DISCUSSION ON KIWANIS CLUB OF LAUDERDALE LAKES 5K RUN

This is a request to host a 5K Run in Partnership with the Kiwanis Club of Lauderdale Lakes and the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

Pauline Jones, Kiwanis Club Representative spoke regarding the Kiwanis Club of Lauderdale Lakes Annual 5K Run. Ms. Jones requested support from the Commission to host the Run on Saturday April 15, 2017 at 8:00 a.m. at Vincent Torres Park and the C-13 Canal. The even supports the Eliminate Project which is an effort between the Kiwanis International and UNICEF to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus.

C. DISCUSSION REGARDING JUNETEENTH DAY

This is a discussion on Juneteenth Day, the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. Juneteenth Day is Celebrated on June 19th each year.

Commissioner Sandra Davey spoke regarding June 19th known as Juneteenth Day and asked if the Commission can celebrate the event during the second Commission Meeting in June. Discussion regarding the City's Birthday Celebration and incorporating Juneteenth and the City's Birthday as one event.

D. DISCUSSION REGARDING THE CITY'S SEAL, LOGO AND SLOGAN

This is a discussion regarding the City's seal, logo and slogan.

City Manager Phil Alleyne explained the difference between the City's official seal, the City's sailboat logo and kalediscope branding logo and slogan. The Commission expressed consensus to

use the City's logo with the sailboat and phase out the kaleidoscope logo and "Life and Full Color slogan by 2018. The Commission expressed consensus with continuing to use the "We Care" slogan.

E. DISCUSSION REGARDING A MILITARY SERVICE COMMITTEE

This is a discussion regarding establishing a committee to recognize and facilitate military service personnel in the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

Mayor Hazelle Rogers spoke in regards to establishing a military affairs board that identifies veterans within the City and assist them with finding resources.

F. DISCUSSION REGARDING SOBER HOMES

This is a discussion regarding Sober Homes within the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

Captain Andrew Dunbar provided an update on Sober Homes. Captain Dunbar stated that it is not clear how many sober homes have opened in the City. That's because people in recovery are by law a protected class of people, meaning they can't be singled out. The Fair Housing Act and Americans with Disabilities Act prohibit cities from specifying where sober homes may be located or from denying a person a place to live. Federal laws also prevent police from logging where sober homes are situated. Captain Dunbar stated that he would like for the City to discussion on sober home regulation. Discussion ensued regarding the need for data and research to figure out how many sober homes are in the City.

G. DISCUSSION REGARDING DISASTER READINESS

This is a discussion regarding the readiness of the City to respond to a major local disaster.

City Manager Phil Alleyne stated that the City has an emergency plan for hurricanes; however, their are three plants within the City that needs to be secured, specifically in the event of an act of terror. The plants are the FPL Sub Station, the Broward County Water Treatment Plant, and AT&T Communication Center. Representatives from the AT&T Communication Center provided information on how to contact them in the event of an emergency.

H. DISCUSSION REGARDING DATES FOR THE CODE ENFORCEMENT WORKSHOP

This is a discussion regarding the date to hold a Workshop related to certain code compliance ordinances.

City Manager Phil Alleyne stated that at the February 13, 2017 Commission Workshop and the February 14, 2017 Commission Meeting the Commission requested a Special Workshop to discuss two proposed Ordinance and asked when would the Commission like to hold the Workshop. The consensus from the Commission is to hold a Special Workshop on Monday, March 20, 2017 at 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 2. CREATION: Division 8 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created and titled as follows:

<u>Division 8 – Military Affairs Board</u>

SECTION 3. CREATION: Section 2-437 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 2-437 – Composition. There is hereby created a Military Affairs Board in the City. The Board shall be composed of five (5) members. The Mayor and each of the other City Commissioners shall make their respective appointments, to be ratified by the City Commission.

SECTION 4. CREATION: Section 2-438 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 2-438 - Powers and Duties. The Board shall:

- (1) Provide the City Commission with recommendations regarding military affairs in Broward County, the several cities of the County and the City, regarding the general welfare of active, reserve, retired, disabled and deceased military personnel within or having strong connections to the City, and
- (2) Promote measures to enhance the quality of life for active, reserve, retired and disabled military personnel and their respective families and the families of deceased military personnel within or having strong connections to the City, and
- (3) Advocate for, on behalf of military personnel within or having strong connections to the City regarding, among other things: health care; housing; housing and business loans; pension benefits; education; Page 2 of 5

- employment; incarceration; reintegration; unemployment benefits; disability claims; vocational training, and insurance, and
- (4) <u>Take steps to increase awareness and support for military personnel from</u>
 the City or having strong connections to the City, and
- (5) Interface with local reserve officer training corps ("ROTC") programs at both the high school and junior high school levels, and
- (6) Form an independent 501(c)(3) corporation, approved by the City

 Commission, which shall raise private funds to assist military personnel

 and perform other functions provided for herein, and
- (7) Accept gifts of money or services for public purposes provided for herein, and
- (8) Work with other similarly focused bodies for the purposes contemplated herein.

SECTION 5. CREATION: Section 2-439 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 2-439 Staff Support and Counsel. The City Manager shall provide the Board with adequate staff to perform its powers and duties, and the Board shall utilize the City Attorney's office for legal services.

SECTION 6. CREATION: Section 2-440 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 2-440 Fiscal Procedures and Budget Appropriation. Funding shall be provided annually through a line-item in the yearly budget in such amount as the City Commission shall deem appropriate.

SECTION 7. CREATION: Section 2-441 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby created as follows:

Sec. 2-441 Reporting Methodologies. The Board shall establish, through the City Clerk's office, a standardized form which shall be used for reporting on all matters which may come before it. All recommendations of the Board shall set forth the nature of the item considered, the action taken, any conditions set forth respecting the action taken and specific reasons supporting such action.

SECTION 8. CONFLICT: All ordinances or Code provisions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 10. INCLUSION IN CODE: It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Lauderdale Lakes that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lauderdale Lakes and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Chapter," "Section," "Article" or such other appropriate word or phrase, the use of which shall accomplish the intentions herein expressed; provided, however, that Section 1 hereof or the provisions contemplated thereby shall not be codified.

The mayor-commissioner and each city commissioner shall each have the right to appoint one member to the economic development board and the city commission, as a whole, shall appoint one at-large member, who shall be a permanent resident of the city at the time of appointment. Florida Medical Center shall nominate one additional member for appointment to the board. Such member shall be confirmed by the city commission. Each board member appointed by the mayor-commissioner or city commissioner shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor-commissioner or city commissioner appointing such member. The at-large member and the member nominated by Florida Medical Center shall serve at the pleasure of the city commission. All such board members shall be appointed at the next regularly scheduled city commission meeting following the commencement of the term of the mayor-commissioner or commissioner making the appointment.

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"), opioids are commonly prescribed for pain, and

WHEREAS, an estimated twenty percent (20%) of patients who visit physician offices with non-cancer pain symptoms or pain-related diagnoses receive an opioid prescription, and

WHEREAS, in 2012 alone, health care providers wrote 259 million prescriptions for opioid pain medication, enough for every adult in the United States to have a bottle of pills, and

WHEREAS, opioid pain medication use presents serious risks, including overdose and opioid use disorders, and

WHEREAS, from 1999 to 2014, more than 165,000 persons died from overdose related to opioid pain medication in the United States, and

WHEREAS, in the past decade, while death rates for the leading causes of death, such as heart disease and cancer, have decreased substantially, the death rate associated with opioid pain medication has increased markedly, and

WHEREAS, the sales of opioid pain medication have increased in parallel with opioid-related overdose deaths, and

WHEREAS, the Drug Abuse Warning Network estimated that greater than 420,000 emergency room visits were related to the misuse or abuse of narcotic pain relievers in 2011, the most recent year for which data is available, and

WHEREAS, scientific research has identified high-risk prescribing practices that have contributed to the overdose epidemic, and

WHEREAS, observational research showed significant increases in opioid prescriptions for pediatric populations, from 2001 to 2010, and that a large proportion of adolescents are commonly prescribed opioid pain medications for conditions such as headaches and sports injuries, and

WHEREAS, use of prescribed opioid pain medication before high school graduation is associated with a thirty three percent (33%) increase in the risk of later opioid misuse, and the misuse of opioid pain medications in adolescence strongly predicts later onset of heroin use, and

WHEREAS, the risk of opioid medication use in pediatric populations is of great concern, and

WHEREAS, on an average day, at least 78 people will die in the United States from an opioid-related overdose, 3,900 people will use a prescription opioid outside of legitimate medical purposes and supervision, and 580 people will try heroin for the first time, and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention created the CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain-United States, on March 18, 2016, in order to help curtail the overprescribing of opioids by physicians through more physician education, as well as better risk and assessment of patients, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Justice ("DOJ") through United States Attorney General, Loretta E. Lynch, sent a letter to the governor of every state on September 20, 2016, requesting help in addressing the prescription opioid and heroin epidemic by requesting assistance in strengthening prescription drug monitoring programs and ensuring safe drug disposal, and

WHEREAS, the National League of Cities and the National Association of Counties formed a national joint task force to address the opioid and heroin abuse epidemic (the "National City-County Task Force on the Opioid Epidemic") on March 7, 2016, which is charged with starting a National dialogue for city and county elected leaders, providing educational opportunities for cities and counties, and providing a National summary report focusing on community prevention and overdose response, effective treatment options, and public safety enforcement and supply reduction.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS: The foregoing Whereas paragraphs are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

Section 2. EXPRESSION OF SUPPORT: The City Commission of the City of Lauderdale Lakes supports the combined efforts of the CDC and DOJ in reducing the number of opioid prescriptions and ensuring safe disposal of such medicines, and it further supports the efforts of the City-County National Task Force on the Opioid Epidemic in educating cities and counties.

Section 3. DIRECTIONS TO THE CITY MANAGER: The City Commission of the City of Lauderdale Lakes hereby authorizes and directs the City Manager to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

Section 4. INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK. The City Commission of the City of Lauderdale lakes hereby authorizes and directs the City Clerk to send a true copy of this Resolution to all cities within Broward County, the Broward County League





Summary

This Resolution accepts the award of the 2016 COPS Grant from the U.S Department of Justice (US DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office), authorizes the City Manager to execute an agreement with the US DOJ to utilize the grant funding, authorizes the City Manager to submit a memorandum of understanding to the Broward Sheriff's Office regarding the administration of the grant including grant reporting and other requirements, and authorizes the City Manager and City Attorney to amendment its agreement with BSO to include the new COPS16 Grant positions.

Staff Recommendation

Background:

City Staff recommends that the City Commission accept the award of the 2016 COPS Grant from the US DOJ. Staff also recommends that the City Commission authorize the proper City Officials to provide a memorandum of understanding to the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) notifying them of the acceptance of the award and providing for BSO to administer the grant and to negotiate the needed changes for the police services agreement between the City and BSO.

Background:

On June 23, 2016, the City submitted an application for the 2016 COPS Grant Program. On September 29, 2016 the COPS Office notified the City that it had approved the City for two (2) sworn police deputy positions under the 2016 COPS Hiring Program (CHP). The estimated amount of federal funds awarded over the three-year grant period is \$250,000.00. The City's estimated local cash match will be \$294,590.52. Note that the grant funds a portion of the salary and fringe benefits. All other costs must be funded by the City.

The City may use COPS grant funding to hire new police officers or rehire police officers who have been laid off, or are scheduled to be laid off on a specific future date, as a result of local budget cuts, on or after the official grant award start date. Any changes to the awarded hiring categories require an official review and approval by the COPS Office.

Only those recipients that can provide a reasonable justification for delays will be granted no-cost extensions. Reasonable justifications may include difficulties in filling COPS Office-funded positions, officer turnover, or other circumstances that interrupt the 36 month award funding period. An extension allows your agency to compensate for such delays by providing additional time to complete the full 36 months of funding for each position awarded. Extension requests must be received prior to the end date of the award.

- 6. Modifications. During the CHP award period, it may become necessary for an agency to modify its CHP award due to changes in an agency's fiscal or law enforcement situation. Modification requests should be submitted to the COPS Office when an agency determines that it will need to shift officer positions awarded in one hiring category into a different hiring category, reduce the total number of positions awarded, shift funds among benefit categories, and/or reduce the entry-level salary and fringe benefit amounts. - 8. Reports/Performance Goals. To assist the COPS Office in monitoring and tracking the performance of your award, your agency will be responsible for submitting quarterly programmatic progress reports that describe project activities during the reporting period and quarterly Federal Financial Reports using Standard Form 425 (SF-425).  - (2) The value of all expected funding increments under a Federal award and options, even if not yet exercised.

- 1. BSO shall administer the COPS Grant on behalf of the City, which will include, but not be limited to, the submittal of cost reimbursement vouchers, recordkeeping, and fiscal and programmatic reporting.
- 2. The CITY and BSO recognize and acknowledge that the COPS Grant is a three (3) year grant with the CITY having an obligation to retain the two (2) positions for the three (3) year grant period plus an additional one (1) year period thereafter as stated in the COPS Grant.
- CITY acknowledges that the COPS Grant does not provide full funding for the position and that the CITY shall be solely responsible for the payment of those costs not covered by the COPS Grant.

RESOLUTION 2017-042

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES URGING SUPPORT OF THE ADEQUATE FUNDING OF THE LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City recognizes basic energy services are a vital key to the health, safety and well-being of Florida households, and

WHEREAS, poverty, unemployment and the slow economic recovery remain persistent national problems for many and, most especially, low-income households, and

WHEREAS, low-income households in Florida must spend, disproportionately, a significantly larger percentage of their incomes on basic energy services than middle-income families, and

WHEREAS, homes in low-income and minority communities severely lack energy efficiency features that can reduce energy consumption, and

WHEREAS, LIHEAP can provide vital heating, cooling and efficiency assistance to low-income households, including working-poor families, senior citizens, persons with disabilities and veterans, and

WHEREAS, the severe constraints on state and local budgets and the increased strain on the Nation's support system provided by nonprofit, faith-based and charitable community organizations have reduced other resources available for energy assistance, and

WHEREAS, the primary Federal program providing assistance to low-income households to support their heating and cooling needs is the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), and

WHEREAS, LIHEAP is not an entitlement but, rather, a limited block grant program which provides flexible Federal-State partnerships to prevent service terminations during cold and hot weather emergencies; to make the transition from public assistance to economic self-reliance, and to help low-income households remain economically self-sufficient, and

WHEREAS, federal LIHEAP funding has declined from \$5.1 billion in 2010, to \$3.4 billion in 2016, and

WHEREAS, due to this limited funding, less than 125,000 Florida households received LIHEAP assistance in 2014, or less than ten percent of the State's eligible households, and

WHEREAS, due to this limited funding, the National Energy Assistance Directors Association has reported that many low-income households will have few choices other than to cut back on essential necessities, such as medicine, food, and clothing, in order to satisfy their energy needs, and

WHEREAS, the National Energy and Utility Affordability Coalition (NEUAC) and other concerned national organizations support restoring LIHEAP funding to at least \$4.7 billion in Federal Fiscal Year 2017,and

WHEREAS, another solution to increase Florida's share of funding, without increasing the overall Federal LIHEAP budget, is for Congressional appropriators to simply "follow LIHEAP's enabling law" – the precise allocation formula actually

prescribed by Congress, and Florida and many other states in great need would see a meaningful increase in their share of LIHEAP funds, as the Program's enabling law calibrates for the dangers of both extreme heat and cold and adjusts funding for changing energy costs, demographics and poverty, and

WHEREAS, the Congressional Research Service's latest (June 25, 2015) estimate confirmed that Florida would receive an additional \$38.5 million in LIHEAP funding - a 55 percent improvement - if appropriations were made4 in accordance with LIHEAP's lawfully-enacted enabling law, even if the Program were simply to be level funded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS: The foregoing Whereas paragraphs are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

Section 2. STATEMENT OF SUPPORT: The City Commission of the City of Lauderdale Lakes, Broward County, Florida, urges the Appropriations Committee of the United States Senate and House of Representatives to both fully follow LIHEAP's enabling law when determining all future appropriations and to restore LIHEAP funding to its historic levels.

Section 3. INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK: The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this Resolution to the President of the United States, Donald J. Trump, President of the United States Senate, Vice-President Michael R. Pence, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives Paul D.

Ryan, Governor Rick Scott, Florida House Speaker Richard Corcoran, President of the Florida Senate Joe Negron, the Florida League of Cities, the Broward League of Cities, any and all municipalities of Broward County.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.
