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### MINUTES Emergency Commission Meeting January 8, 2015 6:00 p.m.

#### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Barrington A. Russell, Sr. called the Emergency Meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. in the Commission Chambers, located at 4300 Northwest 36th Street, Lauderdale Lakes, Florida 33319

#### ROLL CALL

Mayor Barrington A. Russell, Sr. requested a moment of silence. Mayor Barrington A. Russell led the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Barrington A. Russell, stated the purpose of the Emergency Meeting. He stated the meeting was called at the request of Commissioner Patricia Williams.

City Attorney Brady gave an overview of what constitutes an emergency meeting as follows:

Section 3.16 (4) - Emergency. Whenever there is a public emergency affecting life, health, property or the public peace and whenever practicable upon no less than twelve (12) hours' notice to each member and the public, the mayor may call an emergency meeting. In addition, upon the request of a majority of the members of the city commission, the mayor shall call an emergency meeting. In the absence or disability of the mayor and vice-mayor, any four (4) members of the city commission may call an emergency meeting. When necessary, the twelve-hour notice requirement may be waived.

Commissioner Patricia Williams stated the reason she requested the Emergency Meeting. Commissioner Patricia Williams stated that she has concerns with the Fiscal Year 2013/2014 Audit and wanted to be proactive because of the financial concerns the City has encountered in the past.

City Attorney James Brady chimed in that the former City Commission was criticized by the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) for not inquiring enough. Attorney Brady stated that considering the City's peculiar circumstances with finances in the past, he feels the meeting is justified.

Commissioner Patricia Williams stated she called the meeting because she has questions as follows:

Are the Auditors receiving materials and information in a timely manner? Are the employees cooperating with the Auditors? Are balances being properly reconciled to close out the Fiscal Year?

Kenneth G. Smith, C.P.A. of the Independent External Auditing Firm, Keefe, McCullough & Company, LLP responded to questions from the Commission related to the questions posed by Commissioner Patricia Williams as well as questions from members of the Commission such as: the hiring of an accounting firm to assist with reconciliations; the number of banks the City has; the experience of the employees currently in the Finance Department; the lack of experience in government accounting in the Finance Department; the shortage of staff in the Finance Department; and previous audit management letter comments.

City Manager Jonathan Allen and Financial Services Director Marie Elianor responded to questions from the Commission regarding monthly reconciliations; the City's consultant McKenzie and Associates; hiring additional staff; and training for staff.

Human Resources and Risk Management Director, D'Andrea Giddens-Jones answered questions regarding the loss of staff, the current staff, and vacancies in the Finance Department.

Former Commissioner Levoyd Williams spoke regarding the current consultant firm, the expense involved with employing new staff, training staff, and staff responsibility.

Byron Maylor, resident, spoke regarding the consultant and hiring someone who has government accounting experience.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

Chairperson Patricia Williams called the Joint Emergency Meeting for the CRA to order at 6:13 p.m. in the Commission Chamber, located at 4300 Northwest 36<sup>th</sup> Street, Lauderdale Lakes, Florida 33319.

#### ROLL CALL FOR THE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY

Russell, Sr. stated the purpose of the Joint Emergency Meeting of the City Commission and Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) is to discuss and consider three motions adopted by the City Commission at the January 27, 2015, Commission Meeting. The apparent effects of such motions are characterized as follows:

- 1. Effective immediately, change the reporting structure of the Executive Director of the CRA to report to the CRA Chair and the CRA Board.
- 2. Effective immediately, divorce the Financial Services Department from the CRA, to include separating the Accounting and Finances of the CRA from the City.
- 3. Effective immediately, modify the composition of the CRA governing structure, including but not limited to the following: the Mayor would have no vote at the CRA Board meetings and/or to add one additional member to the CRA Board.
- 4. To discuss the Service Agreement.

Commissioner Patricia Williams stated that the language in the Motions on the Notice is not the same as the Motions she made on January 27, 2015.

Vice Mayor Beverly Williams made a motion to reconsider the Motions with the language to read exactly as stated: 1). Effective immediately the Executive Director of the CRA should report to the Chair and the Board of the CRA; 2) The Accounting and Finances of the CRA be separated allowing for greater accountability and transparencies; 3) Compliance with State Statute 163.357 be moved to withdraw the motion previously approved with respect to the composition of the CRA. The previous two motions are to be codified as an Ordinance within 30 days of acceptance. Mayor Russell asked three times if there was anyone from the prevailing side who wished to second the Motions. The Motion failed due to lack of a second.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:05 p.m.

#### 3. DISCUSSION

JUNE 23, 2015 AGENDA REVIEW

Acting City Manager Danny Holmes reviewed the June 23, 2015 Commission Meeting Agenda with the City Commission as follows:

Commissioner Edwina Coleman asked who was sponsoring the Presentation to honor participants of the City of Lauderdale Lakes sports teams. Parks and Human Services Director Treasa Brown Stubbs stated that she is the sponsor of the item.

ORDINANCE 2015-09 CREATING SECTION 66-3 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITIONS WITH REGARD TO EXECUTIVE EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTING TO THE POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS OF INCUMBENTS AND OTHER CANDIDATES FOR MUNICIPAL OFFICE WITHIN THE CITY.

This Ordinance would create Section 66-33 of the Code of Ordinances prohibiting the City Attorney, City Clerk and executive employees from contributing to the political campaigns of incumbents and other candidates for municipal office within the City.

City Attorney James Brady provided the Commission with an overview related to a proposed Ordinance 2015-09 which would create a provision in the Code that prohibits the City Attorney, City Clerk and Executive Staff from contributing to municipal elections within the City.

RESOLUTION 2015-73 RATIFYING THE CITY MANAGER'S FILING OF THE CITY'S FISCAL YEAR 2015, PERIOD 8 (MAY), FINANCIAL ACTIVITY REPORT

This is a Resolution ratifying the filing and presentation of the City's Fiscal Year 2015 May (Period 8) - Financial Activity Report provided by the Financial Services Department

Financial Services Director, Marie Elianor presented and responded to questions from the Commission regarding the May 2015 Financial Activity Report. City Manager Danny Holmes, City Attorney James Brady and Mrs. Elianor responded to questions from the Commissioner regarding the status of separating the City's Finance Department from the CRA, the Bank the CRA uses, the net assets in Stormwater, and preliminary Stormwater Projects.

RESOLUTION 2015-74 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THIRTEEN MASTER EQUITY LEASE AGREEMENT PACKAGES, INCLUDING AMENDMENTS TO MASTER EQUITY LEASE AGREEMENT ADDENDA, WITH ENTERPRISE FM TRUST, A DELAWARE STATUTORY TRUST ("ENTERPRISE") FOR THE LEASE OF THIRTEEN VEHICLES TO BE USED TO REPLACE EXISTING CITY VEHICLES

This is a Resolution authorizing the Acting City Manager to execute equity lease agreements for the leasing of replacement vehicles.

Public Works Director, Manny Dlez provided the Commission with an overview of the lease agreement packages intended for the purpose of replacing and/or leasing new vehicles for the City's Public Works and Code Enforcement Departments. Mr. Diez and David Nunez, representative of Enterprise Fleet Management responded to questions from the Commission regarding the fair price estimate comparison.

RESOLUTION 2015-75 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE AND ATTEST, RESPECTIVELY, THAT CERTAIN CONTRACT WITH DRMP, INC. FOR CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING INSPECTION ("CEI") SERVICES, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$54,919.20, FOR THE NORTHWEST 21ST STREET ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT NO. 15-6210-04B

This is a Resolution authorizing a contract with DRMP, Inc., for construction engineering inspection services for street improvements to Northwest 21st Street. As the Contractor of Record, DRMP, Inc. will provide construction engineering inspection services. The cost of these services will be billed at a not-to-exceed amount of \$54,919.20.

Sonia Torres, City Engineer was available to respond to questions from the Commission. The Commission did not have any questions regarding the item.

**RESOLUTION 2015-76** RATIFYING THE APPOINTMENT OF DANNY HOLMES AS ACTING CITY MANAGER

This Resolution serves to ratify the appointment of Danny Holmes as the Acting City Manager for the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

City Attorney James Brady responded to questions from the Commission regarding the reason the item was not placed on the Workshop for discussion prior to being placed on the Agenda as a Resolution as well as the content of the Resolution. Mr. Brady commented that the content of the Resolution being presented is not what he initiated. He stated that he sent the City a draft Resolution to finalize but had not seen the final version before the Agenda was printed. City Attorney Brady stated that in speaking with Acting City Manager Danny Holmes, they agreed that the item should be scheduled for a workshop discussion.

Commissioner Gloria Lewis reminded the Commission that she requested information which would show an increase in pay at 10%, 20%, and 30% of the Acting City Manager's current salary. Commissioner Gloria Lewis also stated that she requested information regarding advertising for the City Manager position.

Acting City Manager Danny Holmes and Mr. Brady also responded to questions from the Commission. The consensus from the Commission was to place two items on the next scheduled workshop. One item related to advertising for the City Manager position and another item related to compensating the Acting City Manager.

A. #### 5. ADDITIONAL WORKSHOP ITEMS

A. DISCUSSION REGARDING THE REVISION IN THE FACILITY FEE STRUCTURE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND HUMAN SERVICES

This is a discussion on proposing a revision in the Parks and Human Services Facility Fee Structure.

Parks and Human Services Director Treasa Brown Stubbs, and Ericka Lockett, Alzheimer's Case Manager presented the proposed Parks and Recreation facility fees and asked the Commission for recommendations related to maintenance and facility fees. Ms. Brown stated that the Department was seeking input from the Commission related to the proposed fees and that a Resolution would be available at the first meeting in July for consideration.

B. DISCUSSION REGARDING A REQUEST FROM MS. BETTY J. LETTS FOR A WAIVER OF DEVELOPMENT REVIEW FEES ASSOCIATED WITH A PROPOSED SINGLE FAMILY DRIVEWAY VARIANCE REQUEST.

This is a discussion regarding Ms. Betty J. Letts, the property owner at 2291 N.W. 34th Avenue, Lauderdale Lakes, proposal to submit a variance application related to an existing expanded driveway on her property. The applicant is requesting a waiver of development review fees in the amount of \$1,050.

Acting City Manager Danny Holmes provided the Commission with information regarding a request from Ms. Betty J. Letts, the property owner at 2291 N.W. 34th Avenue, Lauderdale Lakes, in reference to a violation on the property related to the driveway. Mr. Holmes stated that the homeowner is requesting a waiver of the variances fees to expand the driveway.

City Attorney James Brady provided information from the City's Code of Ordinance related to variances. Discussion ensued amongst the Commission related to the existing Code. The consensus of the Commission is to draft a Resolution related to the Variances for consideration.

C. DISCUSSION REGARDING STATE PROBATION OFFICE WITHIN THE LAUDERDALE MARKETPLACE

This is a discussion regarding State Probation Offices within the Lauderdale Marketplace and the consequences the operations are having on law enforcement within the City.

Acting City Manager Danny Holmes, Captain Andrew Dunbar and Lieutenant Sean Eser of the Broward Sheriff's Office responded to questions from the Commission regarding the State Probation Office and its impact on police resources within the City. The consensus of the Commission is to have City Attorney James Brady to send a letter to the State to request a meeting between the State, City and Sheriff's Office regarding the concerns related to police transporting of probationers and how it is depleting the City's police resources.

#### Summary

This Resolution authorizes the Acting City Manager to execute agreements for the acquisition of five (5) replacement vehicles.

### Staff Recommendation

#### **Background:**

In February 2015, Public Works Department presented the 2015-2019 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) for review and comment by the City Commission. The CIP contained a project and budgetary information for the replacements contemplated in this resolution. On March 24, 2015, the City Commission adopted Ordinance 2015-03 amending the 2015 adopted budget and thereby providing funding for these purchases.

The Public Works Department, through the Purchasing Division, issued RFP# 15-1301-02R Purchase/Lease/Finance Municipal Utility Vehicles, which was responded to by three companies. The City Commission, acting on the recommendation of the selection committee, ranked Enterprise Fleet Management (Enterprise) as the highest ranked proposal and authorized the City Manager to negotiate vehicle replacement contracts with this firm in resolution 2015-41.

Staff recommends approval of this resolution:

- Three of the vehicles will be used in the Stormwater Division and paid out of the Stormwater Fund and two of the vehicles will be used in the Streets Division and paid out of the Transportation (Gas Tax) Fund.
- The vehicles selected are the lowest priced vehicle in the category of the vehicle being replaced.
- All vehicles are being acquired with a full bumper-to-bumper warranty including full scheduled maintenance.
- The acquisition is being executed using a pre-paid capital lease in order to take advantage of municipal incentives and the Enterprise Fleet Management professionally managed fleet services in managing the extended warranty and scheduled maintenance.
- The City retains 100% of the financial equity in the vehicle from inception until City choses to either take title or liquidate.
- At the option of City and at any time, capital lease may be converted to vehicle sale with no additional costs.

# EXHIBIT D- VEHICLE ACQUISITION

#### MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

This Maintenance Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into this twelfth day of May, 2015, by Enterprise Fleet Management, Inc., a Missouri corporation ("EFM"), and City of Lauderdale Lakes ("Lessee").

#### WITNESSETH

1. LEASE. Reference is hereby made to that certain Master Equity Lease Agreement dated as of the twelfth day of May, 2015, by and between Enterprise FM Trust, a Delaware statutory trust, as lessor ("Lessor"), and Lessee, as lessee (as the same may from time to time be amended, modified, extended, renewed, supplemented or restated, the "Lease"). All capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined in this Agreement shall have the respective meanings ascribed to them in the Lease.

2. COVERED VEHICLES. This Agreement shall only apply to those vehicles leased by Lessor to Lessee pursuant to the Lease to the extent Section 4 of the Schedule for such vehicle includes a charge for maintenance (the "Covered Vehicle(s)").

3. TERM AND TERMINATION. The term of this Agreement ("Term") for each Covered Vehicle shall begin on the Delivery Date of such Covered Vehicle and shall continue until the last day of the "Term" (as defined in the Lease) for such Covered Vehicle unless earlier terminated as set forth below. Each of EFM and Lessee shall each have the right to terminate this Agreement effective as of the last day of any calendar month with respect to any or all of the Covered Vehicles upon not less than sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party. The termination of this Agreement with respect to any or all of the Covered Vehicles shall not affect any rights or obligations under this Agreement which shall have previously accrued or shall thereafter arise with respect to any occurrence prior to termination, and such rights and obligations shall continue to be governed by the terms of this Agreement.

4. VEHICLE REPAIRS AND SERVICE. EFM agrees that, during the Term for the applicable Covered Vehicle and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, it will pay for, or reimburse Lessee for its payment of, all costs and expenses incurred in connection with the maintenance or repair of a Covered Vehicle. This Agreement does not cover, and Lessee will remain responsible for and pay for, (a) fuel, (b) oil and other fluids between changes, (c) tire repair and replacement, (d) washing, (e) repair of damage due to lack of maintenance by Lessee between scheduled services (including, without limitation, failure to maintain fluid levels), (f) maintenance or repair of any alterations to a Covered Vehicle or of any after-market components (this Agreement covers maintenance and repair only of the Covered Vehicles themselves and any factory-installed components and does not cover maintenance or repair of chassis alterations, add-on bodies (including, without limitation, step vans) or other equipment (including, without limitation, lift gates and PTO controls) which is installed or modified by a dealer, body shop, upfitter or anyone else other than the manufacturer of the Covered Vehicle, (g) any service and/or damage resulting from, related to or arising out of an accident, a collision, theft, fire, freezing, vandalism, riot, explosion, other Acts of God, an object striking the Covered Vehicle, improper use of the Covered Vehicle (including, without limitation, driving over curbs, overloading, racing or other competition) or Lessee's failure to maintain the Covered Vehicle as required by the Lease, (h) roadside assistance or towing for vehicle maintenance purposes, (i) mobile services, (j) the cost of loaner or rental vehicles or (k) if the Covered Vehicle is a truck, (i) manual transmission clutch adjustment or replacement, (ii) brake adjustment or replacement or (iii) front axle alignment. Whenever it is necessary to have a Covered Vehicle serviced, Lessee agrees to have the necessary work performed by an authorized dealer of such Covered Vehicle or by a service facility acceptable to EFM. In every case, if the cost of such service will exceed \$50.00, Lessee must notify EFM and obtain EFM's authorization for such service and EFM's instructions as to where such service shall be made and the extent of service to be obtained. Lessee agrees to furnish an invoice for all service to a Covered Vehicle, accompanied by a copy of the shop or service order (odometer mileage must be shown on each shop or service order). EFM will not be obligated to pay for any unauthorized charges or those exceeding \$50.00 for one service on any Covered Vehicle unless Lessee has complied with the above terms and conditions. EFM will not have any responsibility to pay for any services in excess of the services recommended by the manufacturer, unless otherwise agreed to by EFM. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, (a) all service performed within one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the last day of the scheduled "Term" (as defined in the Lease) for the applicable Covered Vehicle must be authorized by and have the prior consent and approval of EFM and any service not so authorized will be the responsibility of and be paid for by Lessee and (b) EFM is not required to provide or pay for any service to any Covered Vehicle after 100,000 miles.

5. ENTERPRISE CARDS: EFM may, at its option, provide Lessee with an authorization card (the "EFM Card") for use in authorizing the payment of charges incurred in connection with the maintenance of the Covered Vehicles. Lessee agrees to be liable to EFM for, and upon receipt of a monthly or other statement from EFM, Lessee agrees to promptly pay to EFM, all charges made by or for the account of Lessee with the EFM Card (other than any charges which are the responsibility of EFM under the terms of this Agreement). EFM reserves the right to change the terms and conditions for the use of the EFM Card at any time. The EFM Card remains the property of EFM and EFM may revoke Lessee's right to possess or use the EFM Card at any time. Upon the termination of this Agreement or upon the demand of EFM, Lessee must return the EFM Card to EFM. The EFM Card is non-transferable.

6. PAYMENT TERMS. The amount of the monthly maintenance fee will be listed on the applicable Schedule and will be due and payable in advance on the first day of each month. If the first day of the Term for a Covered Vehicle is other than the first day of a calendar month, Lessee will pay EFM, on the first day of the Term for such Covered Vehicle, a pro-rated maintenance fee for the number of days that the Delivery Date precedes the first monthly maintenance fee payment date. Any monthly maintenance fee or other amount owed by Lessee to EFM under this Agreement which is not paid within twenty (20) days after its due date will accrue interest, payable upon demand of EFM, from the date due until paid in full at a rate per annum equal to the lesser of (i) Eighteen Percent (18%) per annum or (ii) the highest rate allowed by applicable law. The monthly maintenance fee set forth on each applicable Schedule allows the number of miles per month as set forth in such Schedule. Lessee agrees to pay EFM at the end of the applicable Term (whether by reason of termination of this Agreement or otherwise) an overmileage maintenance fee for any miles in excess of this average amount per month at the rate set forth in the applicable Schedule. EFM may, at its option, permit Lessor, as an agent for EFM, to bill and collect amounts due to EFM under this Agreement from Lessee on behalf of EFM.

7. NO WARRANTIES. Lessee acknowledges that EFM does not perform maintenance or repair services on the Covered Vehicles but rather EFM arranges for maintenance and/or repair services on the Covered Vehicles to be performed by third parties. EFM MAKES NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, WITH RESPECT TO ANY PRODUCTS, REPAIRS OR SERVICES PROVIDED FOR UNDER THIS AGREEMENT BY THIRD PARTIES, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY AS TO MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIFICATIONS, OPERATION, CONDITION, SUITABILITY, PERFORMANCE OR QUALITY. ANY DEFECT IN THE PERFORMANCE OF ANY PRODUCT, REPAIR OR SERVICE WILL NOT RELIEVE LESSEE OF ITS OBLIGATIONS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING THE PAYMENT TO EFM OF THE MONTHLY MAINTENANCE FEES AND OTHER CHARGES DUE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.

8. LESSOR NOT A PARTY. Lessor is not a party to, and shall have no rights, obligations or duties under or in respect of, this Agreement.

9. NOTICES. Any notice or other communication under this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered in person or sent by facsimile, recognized overnight courier or registered or certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid, to the applicable party at its address or facsimile number set forth on the signature page of this Agreement, or at such other address or facsimile number as any party hereto may designate as its address or facsimile number for communications under this Agreement by notice so given. Such notices shall be deemed effective on the day on which delivered or sent if delivered in person or sent by facsimile, on the first (1st) business day after the day on which sent, if sent by recognized overnight courier or on the third (3rd) business day after the day on which mailed, if sent by registered or certified mail.

10. MISCELLANEOUS. This Agreement embodies the entire Agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be amended only by an agreement in writing signed by EFM and Lessee. Any provision of this Agreement which is prohibited or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions of this Agreement or affecting the validity or enforceability of such provisions in any other jurisdiction. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns, except that Lessee may not assign, transfer or delegate any of its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of EFM. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of Missouri (without reference to conflict of law principles).

# RESOLUTION 2015-79 ENDORSING THE BROWARD COUNTY CHIEFS OF POLICE ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INJUNCTION PROCESS

### Summary

This Resolution endorses the Broward County Chiefs of Police Association committee report and recommendation regarding the Domestic Violence Injunction Process.

### **Staff Recommendation**

### **Background:**

The Broward County Chiefs of Police Association formed a committee, which included the participation of many stakeholders in Broward County, to re-examine the current process for victims of domestic violence. After months of research, analysis and meetings, the association issued a comprehensive report examining the current state of the law and the process in Broward County. Points of consensus developed by the committee shine an intense light on what we are failing to do for victims and how we can do more. A major theme included the recognition that the law and the process for victims have not caught up with basic technology available in our daily lives.

Some of the recommendations require the Florida Legislature to amend statutes, the Florida Supreme Court to amend rules of procedure and the courts to implement technology enhancements. Other recommendations require a local commitment to do better. For instance, currently all victims wanting court-ordered protections from domestic violence must go in person to the main courthouse. Often, the victims, and their children, wait hours if not the entire day at the courthouse. While there is a system theoretically available for electronic filing of petitions, the committee was unanimous is concluding that efiling system is neither realistically nor meaningfully available to the victims. Even if victims could e-file, they must still go to the main courthouse to obtain a valid order of protection.

The committee recommended, with the support of the clerk of court, the three regional courthouses in Hollywood, Deerfield Beach and Plantation be made available for victims to file petitions for injunctions and to obtain the resulting court orders of protection. Implementation requires the court system to finish technology enhancements, which in the opinion of the committee should be expedited. The work of the committee has already generated positive results. The clerk of court has hired additional staff and refocused resources for victims. Going forward, many of the other thoughtful recommendations will require the participation and support of the Broward County Board of County Commissioners, the clerk of courts, the judges and others.

## **RESOLUTION 2015-79**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES, FLORIDA, ENDORSING THE BROWARD COUNTY CHIEFS OF POLICE ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INJUNCTION PROCESS; ENCOURAGING STAKEHOLDERS TO PARTICPATE IN IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CHIEFS OF POLICE COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, domestic violence is one of the most wide-spread problems in our society, as it affects women, men, and children of all racial, social, religious, ethnic and economic groups, can have a huge range of consequences if it is not addressed, and has even led to deaths in some cases, and

WHEREAS, the ramifications of domestic violence are staggering, and the tragedy of domestic violence touches all of our lives by weakening families, leaving emotional scars as devastating as physical ones and creating a destructive cycle of violence, where those who were abused as children may become abusers themselves, and

WHEREAS, the public often bears the financial and economic costs of domestic violence through increased medical expenses, expenditure of social service resources, dedication of precious judicial and law enforcement resources, and other costs, and

WHEREAS, although great strides have been taken to educate people about domestic violence, an average of three women die each day in America as a consequence of domestic violence; one in four women and one in thirteen men will be the victim of domestic violence in their lifetimes; and domestic violence still often goes unreported, and

WHEREAS, victim-survivors of domestic violence are permitted, and even encouraged, to seek emergency protection through a court ordered temporary injunction against domestic violence against an alleged abuser, which injunction is intended to prevent contact and/or communication between abusers and victims, and

WHEREAS, the process of obtaining an emergency injunction against domestic violence does not require a hearing or notice to the abuser and, when granted, the protections afforded are effective until such time as the court sets a hearing, and

WHEREAS, the entry of an emergency injunction against domestic violence allows law enforcement to arrest and take into custody alleged abusers, if they violate the terms of the temporary injunction orders, and

WHEREAS, the timely entry of an emergency injunction against domestic violence can minimize the trauma of domestic violence, prevent additional harassment and further abuse, as well as save lives, and

WHEREAS, there are many reasons a victim-survivor of domestic violence may feel afraid or discouraged to seek an emergency injunction against domestic violence, but the legal process of obtaining these necessary protections should not be one of these reasons, and

WHEREAS, currently, in order for any victim-survivor of domestic violence to obtain an emergency injunction against domestic violence, the victim in Broward County must go in person to a single location in Broward County - the main courthouse in downtown Fort Lauderdale, and

WHEREAS, victim-survivors often have no choice but to bring their children, and after victims navigate through the courthouse, they go to a room often crowded with victims, advocates and children, and

WHEREAS, some domestic violence victim advocates say the process is slow and can unintentionally discourage victims from seeking protection, and

WHEREAS, some domestic violence victim advocates report victims and their children, despite being encouraged to arrive at the courthouse early in the day, sometimes must wait the entire day at the courthouse before receiving the court-approved temporary injunction order, some victims are told to come back at 5:00 P.M., an option which may not be realistic, and all are told they could alternatively choose to obtain the judge's order entering a temporary injunction order, or denying such, via U.S. mail, which is fraught with delays and potential dangers should the abuser obtain the copy delivered in the mail, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the current process, victim-survivors may need to seek leave from their jobs, foregoing money that would have been earned to help them secure safe and alternative housing and other costs of living for themselves and their children, because they must wait all day at the courthouse, and

WHEREAS, precious and finite domestic violence advocate resources are consumed assisting victims through the current lengthy process of the securing the temporary injunction order, and

WHEREAS, although technology has improved our lives in so many ways, for victim-survivors of domestic violence in Broward County, technological advances have eluded the process of obtaining necessary and timely protections from abusers, and

WHEREAS, New Jersey courts launched a successful program where victimsurvivors of domestic violence in hospitals are linked through teleconference with hearing officers at the courthouse or to duty judges after hours, a system which allows the victims to give their version of events and the restraining orders are decided immediately, and

WHEREAS, if the process for obtaining restraining orders in New Jersey can be done with technology from busy hospitals, similar techniques should be utilized from satellite courthouses, approved domestic violence shelters and police stations for victim-survivors of domestic violence, and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Chiefs of Police Association (BCCPA) formed a Committee to evaluate the current process in Broward County for victim-survivors of domestic violence to seek emergency court-order protections, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA Committee on Domestic Violence Injunction Process in Broward County represented a broad spectrum of stakeholders in Broward County representing law enforcement, the Clerk of Courts, the Office of Trial Court Administration for the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit, the State Attorney's Office, law enforcement victim advocates, victim advocates from domestic violence shelters and organizations, organizations who provide legal assistance to victim-survivors, and other organizations who serve as advocates for victim-survivors of domestic violence, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA Committee took months researching and analyzing the law, the process, the challenges victim-survivors (and their advocates) face and the resources available to help victim-survivors of domestic violence, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA Committee issued on June 10, 2015, a Report and Recommendation which contained points of consensus and recommendations to improve the process for victims and that was Report and Recommendations was unanimously ratified by the BCCPA, and

WHEREAS, based upon the BCCPA Committee findings, the current legal process in Florida and in Broward County for victim-survivors of domestic violence to obtain emergency protections through an injunction against domestic violence is antiquated, unnecessarily laborious and fails to fully meet the challenges faced by victim-survivors of domestic violence, and

WHEREAS, amongst the ten (10) broad consensus points and resulting recommendations, the BCCPA Committee unanimously agreed the current Statewide electronic filing system is virtually unavailable to self-represented victim-survivors of domestic violence because (a) the manual to learn the e-filing system is one-hundred and one (101) pages long; (b) e-filing requires informational technology infrastructure; (c) e-filing requires some level of information technology sophistication, and (d) in the disorienting circumstances in the aftermath of domestic violence and considering the need for emergency court-ordered protections, it is too much to believe that victims survivors will be able to meaningfully navigate the e-filing system, and

WHEREAS, through the process of the BCCPA Committee work, the Clerk of Courts began some improvements, including dedicating four (4) additional personnel to the injunction process, re-purposing rooms to allow more privacy for victim-survivors when seeking emergency court-ordered protections and providing additional information on the Clerk of Court's website, and

WHEREAS, the time has come to utilize and deploy technology to help victimsurvivors of domestic violence and streamline an antiquated process involving injunctions against domestic violence, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA Committee identified a number of concerns regarding the process for victim-survivors on Broward County to seek injunctions against domestic violence:

• The only location to file a petition seeking protections is at the main courthouse;

• This single location requires victims to travel to the courthouse, sometimes with their children, pay for parking and for some it is a substantial distance;

• The process for filing the petition through actually obtaining an order can take the entire day;

• Those victims waiting for an order providing protection often have children with them and, as a result, the area where victims prepare petitions and wait is often crowded and chaotic;

• To avoid waiting for the entry of an injunction order, victims are told they can have the injunction delivered via US mail; however this is not a realistic option for most seeking emergency protection in so far as there is time delay in delivery and some victims may not know where they will be in the coming days;

• Technology is not being fully deployed to efficiently process the petitions from filing to execution of an injunction order;

• Electronic filing of petitions for injunction by through the state portal by victims, whether represented or unrepresented, while theoretically available, is simply

not a realistic option for victim-survivors. The manual to learn how to e-file is 101 pages. E-filing requires computer infrastructure and technology experience to navigate the system;

 The current courthouse has petitioners and respondents (alleged abusers), contrary to established recommendations regarding separation, in the same hallway leading to unsafe and intimidating conditions;

• In the current courthouse in-custody respondents are walked right by the victim-survivors due to the lack of a secure transport system;

• There are no accommodations for victims to park, either at the time of filing a petition or during the court process;

• The proposed plan for separation of petitioners and respondents outside the courtrooms in the new courthouse, while well-intentioned, is not sufficient, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA Committee identified points of consensus:

• There is a need to provide additional safe locations where victims are able to file and process petitions for injunction against domestic violence;

• The current state-wide system for electronic filing of petitions for injunction against domestic violence is not user friendly for *pro se* victims of domestic violence and, therefore, is not a meaningful opportunity for *pro se* victims to avoid in person filing at the singular location in the County;

• The current physical process for victims to obtain certified copies of orders granting injunctions and emergency service packets is an impediment to fully utilizing the capabilities of the electronic filing portal;

 Greater use of technology for the filing and processing of petitions for injunction against domestic violence could streamline the process for the Clerk's office and the Judiciary;

• The Clerk's office and Judiciary, as well as victims, could directly benefit from more domestic violence advocates to guide and assist victims through the process of filing petitions for injunction against domestic violence;

• The current courthouse layout for injunction hearings is less than ideal for victims, adds to the stress on victims and their advocates associated with proceeding through the court process and generates preventable and foreseeable risks and dangers to victims and their advocates;

• While collaboration and cooperation in the planning for the new courthouse as it relates to the domestic violence court process, including the filing of petitions for injunction against domestic violence, gave due consideration to some of the concerns presented in the current courthouse, additional analysis and steps are necessary to fully address concerns noted in this report;

• While the issues facing domestic violence victim-survivors as identified herein were focused on Broward County, the Committee notes that these same issues are faced state-wide by victim-survivors of domestic violence;

• Any improvements and/or changes to the process for victims to file and seek petition for injunction against domestic violence, including expanded availability of electronic portal filing with the assistance of advocates, requires additional educational efforts community wide;

• The Committee recognizes there are many stakeholders who should be interested in this Report and Recommendation and, therefore, this Report and Recommendation should be distributed widely, and

WHEREAS, the BCCPA issued Recommendations to address the process victim-survivors of domestic violence must navigate to obtain necessary emergency protections:

• Implement Legislative Changes to Allow the Full Deployment of Technology to Streamline the Process for Victim-Survivors of Domestic Violence;

Expand E-Signature for Judicial Execution of Injunctions;

• Utilize Regional Courthouses for Filing of Petitions;

 Utilize Regional Courthouses for Production of Certified Orders and Emergency Packets;

• Develop and Implement Process To Provide Certified Copies and Emergency Packets at Designated Approved Locations;

• Expand E-Filing Training (for advocates);

Validate Parking for Victim-Survivors of Domestic Violence Seeking
Injunctions and for Final Hearings;

- Develop Partnerships for Transportation;
- Utilize Regional Courthouses for Hearings on Petitions;
- Increase Training for Volunteer Advocates;
- Develop a Domestic Violence Victim Advocates Program;

 Take Appropriate Steps to Increase Security on the 8th Floor Outside Courtrooms;

RESOLUTION 2015-80 APPROVING THE 2015 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) ALLOCATION TOTALING \$23,209.00 TO PROMOTE SAFETY AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Summary

This Resolution would approve the 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) allocation. The City of Lauderdale Lakes is requesting \$23,209.00 of the FY2015 JAG Grant funds to promote safety and community involvement by providing funds for educational outreach, analytical support and Detail Deputies.

### Staff Recommendation

### **Background:**

The City of Lauderdale Lakes is being allocated \$23,209.00 from the FY2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program. The Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Grants Management will be allocating 7.23% or \$1,678.01 to cover the costs associated with administering the grant.

The balance of \$21,530.99 will be allocated within the City of Lauderdale Lakes. The City of Lauderdale Lakes is requesting \$4,530.99 of the FY2015 JAG Grant funds for education and enforcement due to a new synthetic drug "Flakka" that has been identified on the streets. An educational solution based initiative will be in educating the community on synthetic drug awareness beginning in the schools, community based organizations and faith based institutions and homeowner's associations to bring awareness and training of "Flakka".

An additional \$2,500.00 will be allocated for publication materials for marketing and educational materials for Law Enforcement personnel as well as the purchase of the synthetic drug kits for identification.

The City of Lauderdale Lakes will support Crime Analyst costs and allocate \$7,500.00 of the FY2015 JAG Grant funds. Analytical support assists in developing intelligence files for operations and relevant background data that assists sworn-law enforcement for enforcement operations.

The remaining \$7,000.00 of the FY2015 JAG funding will be allocated for one hundred sixty six (166) Special Detail Hours to promote safety and community involvement by providing funding for Deputies to be assigned to the City Parks during community and sporting events. Deputies will engage players, parents, and spectators to learn of community concerns and provide dialogue to resolve social or law enforcement issues. While assigned to a Special Detail, Deputies will be free from normal calls for services and will be strictly dedicated to the specified City Park during their tour for duty.
