

General Contract for Services

This Contract for Services ("Contract") is made effective as of June 08, 2026 ("Effective Date") by and between City of Lauderdale Lakes ("Recipient") of 4300 NW 36th ST, Lauderdale Lakes, Florida 33319, and Culinary Affairs ("Provider") of 2400 Griffin Rd, Ft Lauderdale, Florida 33312.

1. Description of Services. Beginning on the Effective Date, the Provider will provide to the Recipient the following services (collectively, "Services"):

Daily snack delivery for City of Lauderdale Lakes summer camp. Snacks to be delivered to 3601 NW 21st Lauderdale Lakes, FL to Willie Webb Park.

2. Payment. The Recipient agrees to pay the Provider as follows:

To be billed and paid Monthly.

If any invoice is not paid when due, interest will be added to and payable on all overdue amounts at 1.5 percent per year, or the maximum percentage allowed under applicable Florida laws, whichever is less.

In addition to any other right or remedy provided by law, if the Recipient fails to pay for the Services when due, the Provider has the option to treat such failure to pay as a material breach of this Contract and may cancel this Contract and/or seek legal remedies.

3. Term. This Contract will terminate automatically on August 11, 2026.

4. Default. The occurrence of any of the following shall constitute a material default under this Contract:

(a) The failure to make a required payment when due.

(b) The insolvency or bankruptcy of either party.

(c) The subjectation of any of either party's property to any levy, seizure, general assignment for the benefit of creditors, application, or sale for or by any creditor or government agency.

(d) The failure to make available or deliver the Services in the time and manner provided for in this Contract.

5. Remedies. In addition to any and all other rights a party may have available according to law, if a party defaults by failing to substantially perform any provision, term, or condition of this Contract (including without limitation the failure to make a monetary payment when due), the other party may terminate the Contract by providing written notice to the defaulting party. This notice shall describe with sufficient detail the nature of the default. The party receiving such notice shall have 2 days from the effective date of such notice to cure the default(s). Unless waived in writing by a party providing notice, the failure to cure the default(s) within such time period shall result in the automatic termination of this Contract.

6. Force Majeure. If performance of this Contract or any obligation under this Contract is prevented, restricted, or interfered with by causes beyond either party's reasonable control ("Force Majeure"), and if the party who is unable to carry out its obligations and gives the other party prompt written notice of such event, then the obligations of the party invoking this provision shall be suspended to the extent necessary by such event. The term Force Majeure shall include, without limitation, acts of God, plague, epidemic, pandemic, outbreaks of infectious disease, or any other public health crisis, including quarantine or other employee restrictions, fire, explosion, vandalism, storm, or other similar occurrence, orders or acts of military or civil authority, or by national emergencies, insurrections, riots, or wars, or strikes, lock-outs, work stoppages or other labor disputes, or supplier failures. The excused party shall use reasonable efforts under the circumstances to avoid or remove such causes of non-performance and shall proceed to perform with reasonable dispatch whenever such causes are removed or ceased. An act or omission shall be deemed within the reasonable control of a party if committed, omitted, or caused by such party or its employees, officers, agents, or affiliates.

7. Dispute Resolution. The parties will attempt to resolve any dispute arising out of or relating to this Contract through friendly negotiations amongst the parties. If the matter is not resolved by negotiation within 30 days, the parties will resolve the dispute using the below Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) procedure.

Any controversies or disputes arising out of or relating to this Contract will be resolved by binding arbitration under the rules of the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator's award will be final, and judgment may be entered upon it by any court having proper jurisdiction.

8. Entire Agreement. This Contract contains the entire agreement of the parties, and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement, whether oral or written, concerning the subject matter of this Contract. This Contract supersedes any prior written or oral agreements between the parties.

9. Severability. If any provision of this Contract will be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions will continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Contract is invalid or unenforceable but that by limiting such provision, it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision will be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

10. Amendment. This Contract may be modified or amended if the amendment is made in writing and is signed by both parties.

11. Governing Law. This Contract shall be construed in accordance with the laws of Florida.

12. Notice. Any notice or communication required or permitted under this Contract shall be sufficiently given if delivered in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address set forth in the opening paragraph or to such other address as one party may have furnished to the other in writing.

13. Waiver of Contractual Right. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Contract shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Contract.

14. Attorney's Fees and Collection Costs. If there is dispute relating to any provisions in this Contract, the prevailing party is entitled to, and the non-prevailing party shall pay, the costs and expenses incurred by the prevailing party in the dispute, including but not limited to all out-of-pocket costs of collection, court costs, and reasonable attorney fees and expenses.

15. Construction and Interpretation. The rule requiring construction or interpretation against the drafter is waived. The document shall be deemed as if it were drafted by both parties in a mutual effort.

16. Assignment. Neither party may assign or transfer this Contract without the prior written consent of the non-assigning party, whose consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
