A. RESOLUTION 2023-114 ADOPTING A FINAL MILLAGE RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024 COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2023, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2024

This resolution establishes and adopts a final operating millage rate to fund Fiscal Year 2023-2024 operations and a second and separate millage rate to fund voter approved debt service obligations for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. Advertising for this public hearing appeared in the Sun Sentinel on September 23, 2023.

Staff recommends approval to adopt a resolution establishing the City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2024 (October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024) final operating millage at 8.6000 (8.5 mills operating and .1 mills reserves). Approval is also recommended to adopt a separate City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2024 final voted debt service millage of .7350 mils for a combined total final millage rate of 9.3350.

B. ORDINANCE 2023-008 APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE FINAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024, COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2023, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2024; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024

This ordinance provides for the adoption of final funding to certain appropriation centers consistent with the City Manager's proposed Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget and subsequent modifications from the Budget Workshop. Advertising for this public hearing appeared in the Sun Sentinel.

Staff recommends approval of the Ordinance establishing the City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget (All Funds) of \$100,846,423. This ordinance appropriates funding for the City's core services including police and fire services.

It is recommended that the City Commission follow the procedures set out in Florida Statutes (F.S.) 200.065:

• Adopt the recommended Final FY 2023-2024 Annual City Budget/Appropriation ordinance after having adopted the final millage rate;

RESOLUTION 2023-114 ADOPTING A FINAL MILLAGE RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024 COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2023, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2024

Summary

This resolution establishes and adopts a final operating millage rate to fund Fiscal Year 2023-2024 operations and a second and separate millage rate to fund voter approved debt service obligations for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. Advertising for this public hearing appeared in the Sun Sentinel on September 23, 2023.

Staff recommends approval to adopt a resolution establishing the City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2024 (October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024) final operating millage at 8.6000 (8.5 mills operating and .1 mills reserves). Approval is also recommended to adopt a separate City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2024 final voted debt service millage of .7350 mils for a combined total final millage rate of 9.3350.

Staff Recommendation

Background:

At the Commission Meeting held on July 25, 2023, Resolution #2023-096 was approved to establish proposed tax rates for inclusion in the preliminary tax statements sent to property owners in August 2023. The City identified two (2) Ad Valorem Tax Rates. One was for operating purposes. The other was for the repayment of debt service. Both of these rates, provided for in this resolution, served as separate not-to-exceed amounts for their respective purposes. A mil represents a specific rate of \$1 per \$1,000 of taxable value. A millage rate of 8.6000, for example, would result in a payment of \$8.60 dollars per \$1,000 of tax assessed value.

The total operating millage for the City of Lauderdale Lakes is recommended at 8.6000 mils. This entire amount is dedicated to operating and capital purposes. The proposed rate initially set by Resolution #2023-113 was set at this same rate and advertised. The rolled-back rate determined by State law for the change in assessed values versus the current rate is 7.8748. The advertised rate of 8.6000 reflects an increase of 9.21% above the rolled back rate.

Debt service for the \$15 million General Obligation Bond approved by the voters in 2004 was issued in FY 2005. For Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the amount needed to fund the voted debt service is .7350 mils. A rolled-back calculation is not computed for voter-approved debt service since the millage levied is the actual amount to fund the debt service.

This resolution, once approved, would establish the following final millage rates for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 – 8.6000 mils for operating and .7350 for voted debt service - for a total City millage of 9.3350. Staff recommends approval of the resolution adopting the City of Lauderdale Lakes Fiscal Year 2023-2024 final operating millage rate and the separate final voted debt service millage rate.

Funding Source:

No current year financial impact. The final property tax millage of 8.6000 mills will fund the contractual obligations for FY 2023-2024 Police and Fire Services; fund core general and other funds' services; and implement Commission priorities identified in the budget. The final voted debt service millage of .7350 mills will fund the actual amount of the debt service.

Summary

This ordinance provides for the adoption of final funding to certain appropriation centers consistent with the City Manager's proposed Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget and subsequent modifications from the Budget Workshop. Advertising for this public hearing appeared in the Sun Sentinel.

Staff Recommendation

Background:

The ordinance adopts the final Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget for the City of Lauderdale Lakes. The appropriations in Exhibit A represent funding to support the City Manager's proposed Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget and additional recommendations made at Budget Workshop discussions with the Commission.

With approval of this ordinance, the resulting final budget was advertised in the Sun-Sentinel and other media outlets according to the requirements of Florida Statute. Advertisement for the Notice of Tax Increase and the Budget Summary will meet statutory requirements for the final adoption of the FY 2023-2024 Annual Final Budget on September 26, 2023 at 6:00 PM in the Commission Chambers at City Hall. With the passage on second reading, the adopted budget for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 will be completed.

Funding Source:

N/A. There is no current year financial impact.

Fiscal Impact:

This ordinance sets the final budget for FY 2023-2024. It effects all funds by fund category General Fund, Special Revenue Funds, Debt Funds, Capital Funds and Enterprise Funds.

The General Fund is supported by the final property tax millage of 8.6000 mills. The General Fund funds the City's highest priority, public safety (Police and Fire Services), through the contractual obligations.

12	WHEREAS, the City of Lauderdale Lakes' ("City") Charter, Preamble, Article V, governs the
13	financial procedures for the City, which includes the creation and adoption of a City budget for
14	each fiscal year;
15	WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Budget, estimates of
16	revenues and other sources, and the requirements for expenditures and other uses of the City's
17	operating funds, departments, offices, and agencies has been prepared by the City staff, and the
18	City Manager has submitted it to the City Commission, as required by Section 5.02 of the City
19	Charter;
20	WHEREAS, the City Commission has received the proposed final annual budget for Fisca
21	Year 2024, commencing October 1, 2023, and ending September 30, 2024, as recommended by the
22	City Manager;
23	WHEREAS, the City Commission has conducted public workshops to receive comments and
24	public input, as well as to analyze and/or revise the proposed budget;
25	WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined the amount of money that must be raised

to conduct the affairs of the municipality, as required by City operating funds, department offices,

WHEREAS, the City Commission has also determined the amount necessary to be raised by ad valorem taxes and other taxes or special assessments upon all of the property, real and personal, within the corporate limits of the City;

WHEREAS, City Staff recommend the approval and adoption of the final Fiscal Year 2024 annual City budget in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Million Eight Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-Three and No/100 (\$100,846,423.00) Dollars and appropriating funding for core City services such as police and fire prevention, protection and emergency medical services;

WHEREAS, City Staff further recommend the approval and adoption of the final Fiscal Year 2024 annual City budget after the adoption of the final millage rate;

WHEREAS, during the budgetary year, the City applies for and receives certain grants, the exact dollar amounts of such grant funding that will ultimately be awarded cannot be ascertained at the time the budget is approved;

WHEREAS, when grant funding and other miscellaneous donations are awarded and accepted by the City, such funding will require a subsequent accounting adjustment in the City's budget;

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it more expedient to allow the resolution accepting the grant funding or other donations to enact the necessary budget transfers and amendments;

1	WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it prudent and in the best interest of the City to
2	authorize the City Manager to appropriate unanticipated revenues in accordance with generally
3	accepted accounting and budgeting principles;

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to grant the City Manager, as the City's Chief Administrative Officer, the necessary authority and flexibility to effectively manage the City's annual budget, along with the City Commission assuming the proper budget approval and oversight authority;

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to enable the City Manager to create "suspension reserve" accounts in each fund and to authorize the City Manager to transfer funds across appropriation centers into such accounts to ensure the proper budgetary stability of all funds at the end of the fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the final public hearing on the Fiscal Year 2024 annual City budget is scheduled for September 26, 2023, at 6:00 PM to be held at City Hall, 4300 NW 36th Street, Lauderdale Lakes, and will be available virtually with instructions to access the meeting can be found on the City's agenda website: https://lauderdalelakes.novusagenda.com/agendapublic/.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2. ADOPTION OF BUDGET. The City Commission hereby approves and adopts the estimates of revenue and expenditures of the City of Lauderdale Lakes for Fiscal Year 2024, commencing October 1, 2023, and ending September 30, 2024, as specifically set forth in the attached **Exhibit "A."**

- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT OF BUDGET: The Fiscal Year 2024 Budget shall be automatically amended to re-appropriate encumbrances, outstanding contracts, and capital outlay of project funds reserved or unexpended from Fiscal Year 2022/2023, provided said appropriation(s) have been previously approved by the City Commission.
- SECTION 4. AUTHORIZATION TO CATEGORIZE ROLL-OVER OF FUNDS: The City Manager is hereby authorized to amend the budget to re-categorize general roll-over funds(s) into a more appropriate fund(s), so long as the general roll-over funds were actually dedicated in the Fiscal Year 2023 budget.
 - SECTION 5. AUTHORITY TO AMEND BUDGET BASED UPON RECEIPT OF GRANT FUNDS: The budget shall be automatically amended upon the adoption of a resolution to accept a grant or donation greater than Twenty-Five Thousand One and No/100 (\$25,001.00) Dollars. Such amendments shall become effective only when such amendments are authorized in the resolution accepting the grant or donation. The budget will be amended upon receipt of a grant or donation in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand One and No/100 (\$25,001.00) Dollars or less. To ensure transparency, a list of all grants accepted and appropriated will be provided to the City Commission at its next regular City Commission Meeting. The list will describe in detail the grants and appropriations and the date of original acceptance.
- SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION OF UNANTICIPATED REVENUES: The City Manager is hereby authorized to appropriate unanticipated revenues according to generally acceptable accounting and budgeting principles.

1	SECTION 7. AUTHORIZATION TO CORRECT SCRIVENER'S ERRORS: The City Manager is
2	hereby authorized to amend the budget on an as-needed basis in order to correct typographical
3	errors or omissions that are purely scrivener's errors.
4	SECTION 8. SUSPENSION RESERVE: The City Manager is hereby empowered to create
5	a "suspension reserve" account in each fund and is further authorized to transfer funds across
6	appropriation centers into this account.
7	SECTION 9. CONFLICT: All ordinances or Code provisions in conflict herewith are
8	hereby repealed.
9	SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or
10	portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of
11	competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent
12	provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this
13	Ordinance.
