The next consideration of such an ordinance shall be made by the city commission prior to November 2004, to permit the matter to be voted upon by the electors at a referendum to be held in November 2004. Thereafter, tThe next consideration of such an ordinance fixing the salary of the mayor at \$20,000.00 annually and fixing the salary of each member of the city commission at \$18,000.00 annually, effective as of January 2025, shall be made by the city commission prior to November 2024, to permit the matter to be voted on by the electors at a referendum to be held in November 2024. Thereafter, an ordinance fixing the salaries of the mayor and members of the city commission shall be considered by the city commission every four (4) years.
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27	SECTION 4. The ballot title and questions for the Charter Amendment proposed in

28 Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be set forth in **Exhibit A** attached hereto.

1 SECTION 5. The Charter Amendment set forth in this Ordinance shall be submitted to 2 a vote of the electors of the City of Lauderdale Lakes at the next general election to be held on 3 November 5, 2024.

If the Charter Amendment set forth in this Ordinance is approved by a 5 majority of the electors voting in the next general election to be held on November 5, 2024, such 6 amendment shall be effective as of the day immediately following the certification of the results 7 of the election.

8 SECTION 7. INCLUSION IN THE CITY CHARTER: Upon adoption, the Charter 9 Amendment set forth in this Ordinance shall be incorporated in the City of Lauderdale Lakes 10 Charter. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered and the word 11 "Ordinance" may be changed to "Chapter," "Section," "Article" or such other appropriate word 12 or phrase, the use of which shall accomplish the intentions herein expressed; provided, however, 13 that Section 1 hereof or the provisions contemplated thereby shall not be codified.

SECTION 8. CONFLICT: All ordinances or Code provisions in conflict herewith are
 hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Violation of this section 7 with the knowledge, express or implied, of the person, corporation, partnership or other organization 8 contracting with or making a sale to the city may render the contract or sale voidable by the city 9 commission.

On an annual basis, City staff prepares a budget calendar to assist in the preparation of the City's operating and capital budget development for the upcoming fiscal year.

Staff Recommendation

Background:

It is recommended that the City Commission review and discuss the Preliminary FY 2024-2025 Budget Calendar and approve the tentative budget public hearing dates to consider the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 millage rate and budget for the City of Lauderdale Lakes.

In addition, City staff requests that the City Commission accept the proposed budget workshop dates of May 7, June 26, July 3, and July 10, 2024 to discuss the budget and City Manager's Budget Proposal on July 22, 2024.

Florida Statute requires that a public hearing on the proposed millage rate and budget be held within 65 to 80 days following the certification of the taxable values by the Broward County Property Appraiser (July 1, 2024).

Municipal budget public hearings cannot be held on the same day as Broward County nor the School Board of Broward County; therefore, the City's proposed dates for its budget public hearings may change once these dates are released.

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER OR DESIGNEE TO IDENTIFY AVAILABLE PARKING SPACES FOR USE AS VETERANS ONLY PREFERENTIAL AND COURTESY PARKING; ENCOURAGING OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND PRIVATE BUSINESS TO CREATE PREFERENTIAL PARKING SPACES FOR VETERANS.

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate for this community to express its appreciation for their service to those individuals who serve or have served in the U.S. Armed Forces and thereby demonstrated a commitment to protecting and defending freedom and liberty in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the City of West Miami was founded by veterans of World War II; and

WHEREAS, one way in which that appreciation may be demonstrated, and which will also provide a convenience and privilege to veterans, is to designate parking spaces in facilities generally open to the public; and

WHEREAS, the City of West Miami owns and operates parking lots and facilities throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, in addition to governmental parking lots, throughout the City of West Miami, there are parking lots and facilities operated by private entities abound in places frequented by the public (e.g., grocery stores, shopping centers/malls, and office buildings), including veterans; and

WHEREAS, in addition to providing designated parking at City facilities, it would be optimal to extend similar parking privileges in parking facilities owned and operated by either other local governments or the private sector; and

WHEREAS, in creating preferential parking for veterans, the City of West Miami would be following the lead of other communities and private entities throughout the United States who have established designated parking for veterans, including Miami Dade County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF WEST MIAMI COMMISSION FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and adopted by this Board as true and correct.

A South Florida city founded by World War II veterans wants to make it easier for fellow veterans to park.

The West Miami city commission passed an initiative Wednesday to designate "veterans only" parking spaces in the city, which is nestled between the Tamiami Trail and Coral Way.

The reserved spaces will be available at city-run parks and facilities. At the commission meeting, commissioner Eric Diaz-Padron, who presented the initiative, held up a sign to show how the spots will be designated. The spaces will say "Veterans Only Parking" with seals of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps and Navy.

"These spaces will not only be a showing of appreciation to our veterans, but also a functional benefit for those who fought in defense of our freedom," said Diaz-Padron. He said the city is looking at which spaces would get the special designation.

"I have requested that they be installed before Veterans Day, at least one will be unveiled on that day," he said. Veterans Day falls on Nov. 11.

How will his city's new designated parking program be enforced? The honor system.

"I have faith that people will respect our Veterans enough to not park in the space," said Diaz-Padron.

He noted that the parking program follows a 2016 resolution by Miami-Dade County vice chairwoman Rebeca Sosa that designated veteran spaces near elevators and entrances at county surface parking lots and garages managed by the county. That program is aimed at serving the more than 60,000 veterans who live in Miami-Dade, according to U.S. Census figures. In 2017, the first space to get that special title was at the pool parking lot of A.D. Barnes Park off Bird Road in Miami. Broward county does not have designated parking spaces for vets, according to the county.

"While we remain forever indebted to our veterans, we must do all that we can to express our deep appreciation and admiration," Diaz-Padron added.

Veterans-only spaces have been popping up around South Florida. Earlier this year, Florida International University, based in Miami-Dade, added a space for veterans at the Veterans and Military affairs parking lot, according to FIU.

The space is for veterans and active, reserve and National Guard soldiers at the main campus, according to <u>Panther.com</u>. More spaces with signs that are marked in blue or gold and read "VETERAN PARKING," are expected on campus. On July 15, the Okeechobee County Sheriff's Office also set up a parking space for veterans in front of the sheriff's office. The sign at the space reads "Thank you for your service."

The sheriff's office said it wants to support veterans who come to the office for business.
